As part of the program, they distributed 1000 grow bags and a variety of vegetable saplings to 500 families, encouraging each household to set up their own kitchen garden. This effort not only promoted self-sufficiency in vegetable cultivation but also created awareness about healthy and eco-friendly living.

To further motivate the families, the volunteers announced that awards will be given to the top 10 kitchen gardens after two months, based on growth, maintenance, and effort. Alongside the distribution drive, the NSS volunteers educated the villagers about effective waste management practices. They explained the importance of segregating biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste and demonstrated simple techniques to convert organic waste into nutrient-rich manure to nourish the kitchen gardens.

Through this impactful initiative, the NSS Unit supported sustainable food practices, while fostering environmental responsibility and active community participation in Chellanam Panchayat.
