## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

### Directorate Of National Service Scheme (NSS)

#### Viksit Bharat Yuva Connect Programme

The Viksit Bharat Yuva Connect Programme was successfully conducted in December 2025 with the objective of strengthening youth engagement and fostering a shared vision of a developed and inclusive India. A total of 39 programmes were organized, with the active participation of 39 institutions, reflecting widespread involvement and collaborative spirit.

The initiative witnessed enthusiastic participation from 6,077 students and youth, who engaged in discussions, awareness activities, and interactive sessions focused on nation-building, civic responsibility, and youth empowerment. The programme served as a dynamic platform to inspire young minds, promote leadership, and encourage meaningful contributions towards the vision of Viksit Bharat.



## Sardar@150 Unity March (26<sup>th</sup> November – 6<sup>th</sup> December 2025)

The Sardar@150 Unity March was a landmark national initiative conducted from Karamsad to Kewadia, covering approximately 182 km, to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. Organized under the aegis of the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports through the MY Bharat platform, the march brought together 150 dedicated Kayami Padyatris, symbolising unity, discipline, and national integration.

During the march, two State-level National Integration Camps and 92 Special Camps were organized along the route, engaging a total of 4,940 participants. These activities promoted the ideals of unity, patriotism, and social harmony, reflecting Sardar Patel's vision of a strong and united India. The Unity March served as a powerful platform to inspire youth participation in nation-building and to strengthen the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat.



## Celebration of Veer Bal Diwas

Veer Bal Diwas was commemorated on 26 December 2025 with great reverence and national pride, honouring the supreme sacrifice and courage of the Sahibzadas. A total of 2,548 NSS volunteers from 51 institutions witnessed the Hon'ble Prime Minister's programme at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, organized by the Ministry of Women & Child Development.

In addition, Veer Bal Diwas was observed across all NSS Units nationwide, with volunteers participating in awareness activities, commemorative programmes, and discussions highlighting the values of bravery, resilience, and patriotism. The observance served as a meaningful reminder of the heroic legacy of the Sahibzadas and inspired youth to uphold the ideals of courage, sacrifice, and service to the nation.

## 150@Sardar Patel National Padyatra

The 150@Sardar Patel National Padyatra was a historic unity march organized to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the architect of India's national integration. The padyatra commenced from Karamsad, the birthplace of Sardar Patel, on 26th November 2025 and culminated at Ekta Nagar (Statue of Unity) on 6th December 2025, covering a distance of nearly 150 km.

During the National Padyatra, 2 National Integration Camps with 440 participants were organised by Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Anand and Shri Govind Guru University at Dabhoi. Further 92 Special Camps were organised along the route and about 15000 volunteers participated in the Ekta March

The march was Led by the Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports, Shri Mansukh Mandaviya, the padyatra saw enthusiastic participation from youth volunteers and citizens nationwide. The march symbolized national unity and patriotism, reflecting Sardar Patel's vision of a strong and integrated India while inspiring youth to contribute to nation-building.


