Kargil Vijay Diwas Padyatra at Drass, Kargil

Recognizing the importance of nutrition in the recovery of TB patients, the NSS Unit has committed to providing continuous nutritional support for six months. Each adopted TB patient receives a nutritious food package consisting of 5 kg atta for energy, 1 kg masoor dal and 1 kg soya bean for protein and strength, 30 eggs to boost immunity, and 1 kg milk to support bone health and recovery.

This compassionate initiative reflects the dedication of NSS volunteers in contributing to the fight against tuberculosis and supporting community health.
