6.	Brief on the importance of place	<p>Dalhousie is situated at a height of 6,728feet.</p> <p>Dalhousie consists of 5 hills of Kathalagh, Potreyn, Terah (called Mothi Tibba), Bakrota and Bhangora. The level walk encircling Moti Tibba and Potreyn Hills is of figure '8'. Tourists can have a pleasant evening walk on this path.</p> <p>Youth Hostel organizes Trekking Programmes for student groups throughout the year. YHAI organizes 'National Himalayan Winter Trekking Programme' at Dalhousie from the 3rd week of December to 1st week of January every Year. Dalhousie receives snowfall during winter.</p> <p>Dalhousie is a beautiful hill station about 80kms from Pathankot and Chakkibank Railway stations. (Travel by road – 3hours)</p>

Place of Tourist Interest

Panchpula – (2.5 km from Gandhi Chowk) a popular picnic spot, where the Samadhi of revolutionary leader sardar Ajit Singh (Chacha of Sardar Bhagaat singh) is located.

Krelnu Fall – A picnic spot, which had been very popular amongst the English families living in Dalhousie during British days.

Bhalwani Devi Temple – (11km by vehicles and the last 3km on foot from Dalhousie – height of 9,80feet) the highest point around Dalhousie, it is a small temple dedicated to wrestlers' goddess. It can be approached via Lakkar Mandi.

Kalatop – (12kms from Dalhousie – height 8,000feet) Halfway between Dalhousie and Khajjar, at Lakkar Mandi, a 3km jeep track leaves the main road and zigzags its way through the dense forests to arrive at Kalatop. It provides a panoramic view of snow peaks around. Most of the scenes in the film “Love Story 1942” were shot there.

Khajjar- (23kms from Dalhousie – height 6,400feet) is a crater formed by the impact of a saucer-shaped Asteroid, which came down from the east. This place is also called “Mini Switzerland” because of its topographical resemblance with Switzerland. A “Khaji Naga Shrine” is situated here.

Joth – (17kms from Khajjar – height 9,000feet) one can get a panoramic view of the snow clad mountain peaks.

Chamba – (52kms from Dalhousie – height 3,000feet)-The Lakshmi Narayan Temple here was built by Sahil Varman in 10th century AD in Shikhara style. Chamba Rumal, Chappal & Chukh are famous. Minjar fair which starts on the 2nd Sunday of the Shravana month (July/Aug) is an important Annual event.

Bharmour – (65kms from Chamba – height 7,240feet) known for apples and very old 6th century archaeological temples: is also called Shiv-Bhumi.

Manimahesh – (28kms from Bharmour –height 13,500feet)- A sacred lake situated at the base of Kailash peak (18,664 feet- believed to be the abode of Lord Shiva) is a famous Hindu pilgrimage centre.

Rock Gardens and Chamera Dam Lake view – Both these points are located on the Dalhousie- Chamba road. Boating is available at the Dam site.

Subhash Boli – Netaji Subhash Chandrabose visited this place most of the time during his 7 months sojourns in Dalhousie in 1937.

St. Johns Church – at Gandhi Chowk was built in the year 1863.

St. Francis Church – at Subhash Chowk was built in the year 1894

Balai Matha Temple – (30kms from Dalhousie) for Kali, worshipped as a powerful Goddess by locals.
